We invite YOU to oppose the following law which was signed by President Biden in March, 2022.

“KAYDEN’S LAW”

“States that enact Kayden’s Law will receive millions of dollars from the federal government.”

This law would prevent FATHERS from claiming parental alienation when mothers claim domestic violence in court.

This law claims:

- Mothers claims of abuse in family court are discredited when fathers claim they are alienated (there is no credible support for this argument).
- “Many experts who testify against abuse allegations lack expertise in the relevant type of alleged abuse, relying instead

on unsound and unproven theories”. (This is false information).

Kayden’s Law has a **gender biased** position on the topic of family / domestic violence.

Our goal is to revoke and /or amend the law to protect children and families, regardless of their gender, from all forms of family violence, *including parental alienation*.
